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4:1-2 What then shall we say that Abraham, our forefather according to the flesh, has found? 2 For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God.

JEWISH ASSUMPTION

"Abraham was perfect in all his deeds with the Lord, and well-pleasing in righteousness all the days of his life."

Jubilees 23:10, 2nd C. BC

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4:3-6 For what does the Scripture say? **"ABRAHAM BELIEVED GOD, AND IT** WAS CREDITED TO HIM AS **RIGHTEOUSNESS.**" 4 Now to the one who works, his wage is not credited as a favor, but as what is due. 5 But to the one who does not work, but believes in Him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is credited as righteousness, 6 just as David also speaks of the blessing on the man to whom God credits righteousness apart from works:

4:8-11 "BLESSED IS THE MAN WHOSE SIN THE LORD WILL NOT TAKE INTO ACCOUNT." 9 Is this blessing then on the circumcised, or on the uncircumcised also? For we say, "FAITH WAS **CREDITED TO ABRAHAM AS RIGHTEOUSNESS.**" 10 How then was it credited? While he was circumcised, or uncircumcised? Not while circumcised, but while uncircumcised; 11 and he received the sign of circumcision, a seal of the righteousness of the faith which he had while uncircumcised, so that he might be the father of all who believe without being circumcised, that righteousness might be credited to them,

4:22-24 Therefore IT WAS ALSO **CREDITED TO HIM AS RIGHTEOUSNESS. 23 Now not** for his sake only was it written that it was credited to him, 24 but for our sake also, to whom it will be credited, as those who believe in Him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead,
